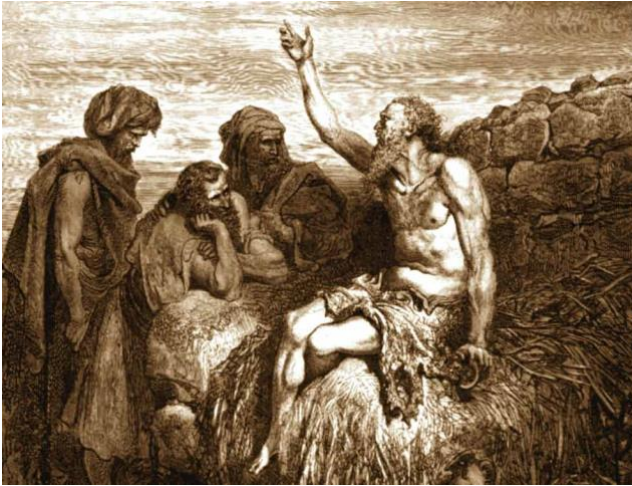

I'll praise thee as I ought.

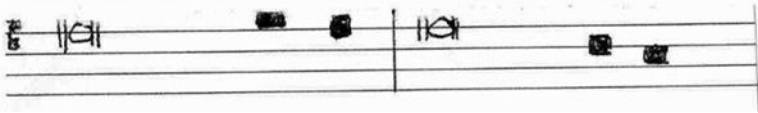
6. Till then I would thy love proclaim
